

## **Connect Group Discussion Guide**

- Our rejection story this week is about keeping the "demons" at bay that can cause us to reject Jesus. Read the Mark verses. There are at least three reasons why a person might reject the freeing, cleansing, and renewing presence of Jesus revealed in this story:
  - We don't want our issues revealed
  - We don't want to lose control
  - Jesus may ask for too much

Do you agree with these reasons for why a person may reject Jesus? Why or why not?

- 2. Naming our issues: In order for healing to come, Jesus requires that we own, name our issues. Some of us may have become accustomed to our "demons", so naming them can be a challenge. What can cause us to become use to our personal "demons"?
- 3. The fallacy is this: we do not want our issue revealed, but they are not hidden because everyone else around us knows our issues. Is there truth to this statement?
- 4. Two principles that might help us here:
  - Principle of self-examination: 1 Corinthians 11:31
  - Principle of confession: James 5:16

If our desire to keep our issues/sins/failings covered is greater than the healing available to us, we reject Jesus. In what way can a person examine their inner self?

5. Jesus transforms our lives; all of our lives! The visible and the invisible, the hidden and the known. How has Jesus transformed you?

NOTE: CGL, listen actively and carefully to what is being said during the times when participants share. Let their responses guide how you tailor your interactions and studies with the group during the session.
